### APPLE BOX (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

(*Eucalyptus bridgesiana*) is widespread on the Western Slopes of NSW, extending to the eastern tablelands. Buds appear in summer around February, lasting a couple of months. The honey is amber, of medium density and a lovely flavour (granulates readily).

### CHIPPY GUM (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

A eucalypt tree mainly around the central coast of NSW. Due to the irregularity of its flowering, straight lines of this honey are rarely obtained. The honey is amber in colour and quite strongly flavoured.

### COOLABAH (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

A small "boxy" eucalypt, found in arid and semi arid regions. The Coolabah can provide heavy flow with good honey over a short period from Mid December to late January. The honey is light in colour with excellent density and flavour.

### GREEN MALLEE (1kg Glass Jars only)

The Green Mallee tree is a eucalypt tree found on the western plains of New South Wales and flowers every two to three years. The tree in a good flowering season produces high yields of honey.

The honey is light in colour, of good density and has a mild pleasant flavour. Our present Mallee honey was produced near Parkes.

### MUGGA IRON BARK (500g & 1kg Glass Jars)

Is a major source of honey in NSW. This honey was produced the Bumberry Ranges west of Manildra. The tree starts flowering in March and continues to flower during winter up until September. The tree produces honey better when the nights are frosty. One of our house favourites. A must try.

### RIVER (RED) GUM (500g & 1kg Glass Jars)

River Red Gum (*Eucalyptus camaldulensis*) is mainly found on western rivers of NSW. It is of major importance as a source of honey, producing heavy yields of nectar in good seasons. The honey is light gold, and has a distinctive flavour. Harvested in the Hillston area in NSW, this honey candies readily.

### STRINGY BARK (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

A stringy bark tree is a eucalypt with many species. Stringy Bark honey is bright and highly coloured, being amber with a reddish tint. The flavour is strong but pleasant and usually liked by those who have a strong palate. This honey was produced in the Cargo/Manildra area.

### WHITE BOX (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

A eucalypt tree found on the Western Slopes of NSW. A most reliable source of honey with flowering occurring every 2 to 3 years. Cold nights and sunny days are necessary for good nectar flows. The honey is particularly light in colour and pleasant in flavour. This honey was produced at Cargo just west of Orange.

### YELLOW BURR (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

(St Barnaby's Thistle) Yellow burr is common in the wheat belt on the tablelands and slopes. Flowering occurs from mid December until the frost arrives. An excellent pollen producers, with very light honey with a greenish tint, and granulates easily.

### YELLOW MALLEE (500g & 1Kg Glass Jars)

(*Eucalyptus incrassate*) Flowers from August to April, producing cream-white-yellow blossoms, producing a dense and sticky honey that tastes like a buttery caramel.

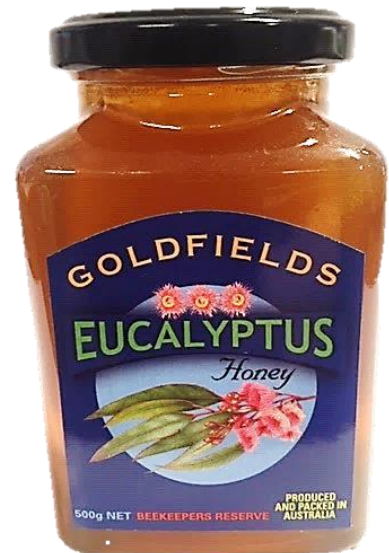
